ICYMI: COVID-19-RELA TED COVERAGE AND PAYMENT

Medicare covering immunocompromised boosters

Medicare stands ready to pay for administering an additional dose of COVID-19 vaccine consistent with the FDA emergency use authorization {ELIA}. We'll pay the same amount to administer this additional dose as we did for other doses of the COVID-19 vaccine {approximately \$40 each}. We'll share more information in the coming days about billing and coding.

COVID-19 Vaccines Additional Doses for Those Who Are Immunocompromised: Codes & Payment

The FDA amended the emergency use authorizations {EUAs) for both the Pfizer BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine (PDF} and the Moderna COVID-19 vaccine (PDF) to allow for an additional dose in certain immunocompromised people.

Effective August 12, 2021, CMS will pay to administer additional doses of COVID-19 vaccines consistent with the FDA EUAs, using CPT code 0003A for the Pfizer vaccine and CPT code 0013A for the Moderna vaccine. We'll pay the same amount to administer this additional dose as we did for other doses of the COVID-19 vaccine (approximately \$40 each).

We'll hold and then process all claims with these codes after we complete claims system updates {no later than August 27). People with Medicare will receive this 3rd dose at no cost to them.

Medicaid and Marketplace booster coverage

In response to the Food and Drug Administration's {FDA) and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's (CDC) recent actions that authorize an additional dose of COVID-19 vaccine for immunocompromised individuals, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) is assuring those enrolled in Medicaid, the Children's Health Insurance Program {CHIP) and most group health plans and health insurance coverage who qualify for this additional dose that they can receive it for free.

COVID-19 Vaccine Updates

CMS in collaboration with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), is developing an emergency regulation requiring staff vaccinations within the nation's more than 15,000 Medicare and Medicaid-participating nursing homes. This new requirement is a key component of protecting the health and safety of nursing home residents and staff by ensuring that all nursing home staff receive COVID-19 vaccinations. Information on COVID-19 Booster Shots

The COVID-19 vaccines authorized in the United States continue to be remarkably effective in reducing risk of severe disease, hospitalization, and death, even against the widely circulating Delta variant. Recognizing that many vaccines are associated with a reduction in protection over time, and acknowledging that additional vaccine doses could be needed to provide long lasting protection, we have been analyzing the scientific data closely from the United States and around the world to understand how long this protection will last and how we might maximize this protection.

Navigator organizations are getting expanded to help people enroll in coverage through the Marketplace, Medicaid, or the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) in 30 states with a Federally-Facilitated Marketplace. Through \$80 million in grant awards for the 2022 plan year, 60 Navigator awardee organizations will be able to train and certify more than 1,500 Navigators to help uninsured consumers find affordable and comprehensive health coverage.

The Navigator awardees include community and conswner-focused non-profits, faith-based organizations, hospitals, trade and professional associations, and tribes or tribal organizations. Navigators help families and other underserved communities gain access to health coverage options through the Marketplace, Medicaid, or CHIP. They can assist with enrollment applications and help consumers receive financial assistance through

HealthCare.gov. With the additional funding, more Navigator organizations can provide assistance to people with limited English proficiency in multiple languages. They can also provide more assistance to rural areas and communities of color.
